How many birds did you see?</p>	<p>Tree Observation Pick a tree in your neighborhood. Draw a picture of the same tree each week. How did the tree change? What stayed constant?</p>
<p>Clouds Go outside and look at the clouds. Draw and describe (use adjectives) what the clouds look like.</p>	<p>Temperature Look at the temperature on a thermometer or phone app. Describe the temperature - warm, hot, cold, or cool.</p>	<p>Five Senses Pick a food from your kitchen. Create a book about that food using your five senses.</p>
<p>Sound Make a list of sounds that you hear while sitting inside your house. Make a list of sounds that you hear while sitting outside.</p>	<p>Nature Walk Go on a walk at the park or your neighborhood. Record all the things you see that are red, orange, yellow, green, blue, and purple.</p>	<p>Bird Needs Create or put out a bird feeder for birds in your yard. Watch for birds to come - what kinds of birds are you noticing?</p>
